In her last meeting as President of the Chelmsford and District Welsh Society, Liz Armishaw welcomed the 57 members to the AGM on 27 June. She said that it had been a great privilege to be President and hoped the members had enjoyed the year as much as she had. There were nine highly enjoyable monthly meetings, the highlights of which were: an evening of song with the popular Welsh tenor, Trebor Edwards; homespun entertainment at the Noson Lawen; and the inspirational talk by Tori James, the first Welsh woman to climb Everest and race to the north pole, which was greeted with a deserved standing ovation. Other outstanding events were: the St Davids Day dinner, with fine speakers in Prof John Davies and Cllr Christopher Kingsley, the then Mayor of Chelmsford; a Cymanfa Ganu (songs of praise); the enjoyable cultural trip to Llangollen; and the wonderful concert at Chelmsford Cathedral given by Cor Godreg Aran and the tenor Aled Wyn Davies. Seven highly successful events were held to raise money for the Presidents Charity, the Js Hospice, and she thanked: Shirley and Don Moody who hosted the garden Party and also a Supper and Sing-a-long; Edith and David Brown, Mair and Brian Thomas and Buddug and Ray Rowland Frank for hosting Coffee Mornings and Afternoon Teas. She and her husband Jim hosted a Musical Evening With Supper. Chelmsford Male Voice Choir with the talented soloist Emily Onsloe gave a fine concert. As a result she was able to present the Jos representative, Stephen Knight, with a cheque for £4100, which was gratefully received. Liz thanked all the members of the committee for their support, and in particular Cynthia Styles who organised the St Davidos Day Dinner, Arthur Williams the concert organiser and Jim. Special thanks were given to Mair Thomas, the Secretary, for her encouraging words of wisdom. Mair reported that there were 104 paid up members, who enjoyed outstanding value for their annual subscription of only £15, considering the costs of hiring the hall, the speakersqfees and the provision of refreshments, including supper on three occasions. She thanked Liz for accepting the office of President enthusiastically, and said that she considered that the quality of the programmes for the year had improved ever since the Presidents had chosen the agendas. She was pleased to serve with an excellent committee, and she thanked Brian for his support. Carys presented the accounts for the year, which were in a healthy state; the final profit from the annual concert will be presented after all the bills have been received.



Meeting and Activities Report September 2013 "CROESO YN ÔL"

Including highlights of this year's National Eisteddfod With Mike Price and supper








The 2013-2014 Season of the Chelmsford and District Welsh Society opened on 26 September with the traditional Croeso Yn Ôl (Welcome Back) Meeting. In her first Meeting as President, Ivy Price welcomed those attending, which included four new members, and outlined the programme for the year: 10 Monthly Meetings; St Davids Day Dinner and Church Service; Songs of Praise; Society Visit to South Wales; the Annual Concert, given by Pontarddulais Male Choir; and 8 Fund Raising/ Charity Events, hosted by various members, and including the annual Garden Party. Ivy has chosen CHESS, the Chelmsford charity catering for the homeless as the Societys Charity during her year of office, and introduced David Hodgson who gave a moving account of the charitys heroic work to alleviate the desperate needs of single, homeless adults: rough sleepers, with a life expectancy of 42: 90% male: 15 times more likely to be assaulted than those of us with homes: 33% of those under 26 attempting suicide; 70% developing mental health problems after 3 weeks of rough sleeping. The charity provides a night shelter, support services and temporary accommodation that helps them move on in their lives. Following an interval during which cheese and wine were served, Mike Price gave a wonderful CD presentation of the Denbigh 2013 National Eisteddfod of Wales. The Festival, the pinnacle of the Welsh cultural calendar, is an annual event which alternates between a north and south Wales venue, attracting 160,000 visitors over 8 days. It is the national stage for music, dance, the visual arts and original performances of all types of culture. Important and spectacular ceremonies are the Crowning and Chairing of the winning bards and the awarding of the Medal for Literature by the Gorsedd of the Bards of the Isles of Britain. Each year the society donates two of the prizes. This year the first prize for the 16-19 girls solo was won by Ceri Haf Roberts a young lady with a marvellous voice who was also part of several winning groups, and the first prize in the 16-19 boys solo went to the talented Sion Eilir Roberts. These were shown in Mikes presentation, which also included a montage of singing, recitation, dancing and instrumental performances. Particularly impressive was the 24 year old tenor Joshua Owen Mills an opera student at the Guildhall School. Buddug R Frank, the Vice-president, congratulated Mike on a superb presentation. With Roger Price







There were several members missing through illness at the 24 October meeting of the Chelmsford and District Welsh Society, but there was still a large audience to hear the guest speaker, Roger Price, deliver his humorous presentation, Many A Slip. Roger, a brother in law to the President, Ivy Price, was born in Treherbert in the Rhondda Valley, before moving to live in Bridgend some 40 years ago. He was the Entertainments Officer for Bridgend (formerly Ogwr) Borough Council, catering for a wide range of entertainment, from highbrow musical events to pantomimes and beauty competitions! He was also Secretary of the prestigious South Wales MinersqEisteddfod, which continued with generous support from the Tower Colliery, the last surviving mine until it too was closed down, a sad case of a thriving vibrant community sinking into tragic unemployment. In these two rolls, Robert commissioned a large number of respected and famous performers, including Wynford Vaughan Thomas the broadcaster, the fine tenor Stuart Borrows, the conductor Sir Adrian Boult and the entertainer Max Boyce. His talk was peppered with humorous tales relating to them and their audiences, one member of which thought Stuart Burrows was ‰ expensive+, as % be bloke in the pub plays the piano all night for £40+. Featured in many of the tales were the poems of the pacifist Waldo Williams, and Idris Davies the Rhymni poet who captured so vividly the differing attitudes towards those starving during the 1920s national strike. Roger recounted how the great African American singer, Paul Robeson, was moved when he heard the starving south Wales miners singing in London to beg for food, saving that it was the first time he had seen white men treated like black men+ (Paul Robeson came from the deep south of the USA, of course). Brother, Mike Price explained how he came to re-master a recording of the 1954 Miners Eisteddfod which featured Paul Robeson over the recently laid transatlantic cable. Robert was given a well-deserved round of applause for his humorous and masterful delivery, and presented with a Society goblet by the Vice-president, Buddug Rowland Frank.


Meeting Report November 2013

"TALES from the ROBING ROOM"

With John Scannel







Members at the November Meeting of Chelmsford and District Welsh Society celebrated Agnes Evans 90 birthday by singing Penblwydd Hapus i Chi. The President, Ivy Price, then welcomed the Guest Speaker, retired barrister John Scannel, whose theme was Tales From The Robing Room. The son of a Port Talbot steel smelter, he was educated at a local grammar school and read Law at Jesus College, Oxford. Port Talbot boasts many famous sons and daughters, including actors Richard Burton and Anthony Hopkins, song writer Ivor Emmanuel, opera singer Rebecca Evans, and Geoffrey Howe QC the Chancellor of the Exchequer. It was no great surprise, therefore, when John gave a masterful performance. Articled in Aberavon to the President of the Welsh Rugby Union, he then moved to London as a Solicitor and law lecturer, and finally practiced as a Barrister for some 30 years. He was also an Employment Tribunal Chairman. His fascinating talk was peppered with tales, many of them hilarious, drawn

on this experience. A small selection included: a man appealing to be excused as a juror as his wife was % bue to conceive+during a trial expected to last 8 weeks; a suspected liar, on being awarded a huge settlement after falling from scaffolding then intending to go on a pilgrimage to Lourdes, where he was confident of a cure+; the Appeal Judge who overturned the death sentence on a dangerous dog, only to be bitten by him subsequently; the acquitted client who, it later transpired, had sent a £10 bribe in his opponents name. John was in favour of courtroom robes as it depersonalises the process, sives a sense of drama and everybody behaves+. This was a wonderful performance indeed, and one felt that he could also have also been a great actor, in the Port Talbot tradition. 

A delicious buffet supper, prepared by Edith Brown and her team, was enjoyed during the interval. Afterwards, Christmas carols were sung in Welsh and English, conducted by Gwyn. He was congratulated by the Vice-president, Buddug Rowland Frank and given a rousing applause. 


Meeting and Activities Report January 2014

He then emigrated to Australia to work in mining and had the distinction of being the first to be breathalysed in West Australia! Then back to sea before joining Lloyds Register of Shipping in Bristol as a surveyor. After a year in hospital following an accident he went back to sea, initially on American tugs in the Ivory Coast, for which he was never paid, and then on tankers for a Dublin firm which traded with Colonel Gadhafi. Finally, 30 years as an expert witness on maritime disputes. His experience of working in other legal jurisdictions was interesting: the USA, % unpleasant, aggressive, personal+; Greece, %haotic+, Sweden and Holland, %dinical, fair+, South Africa and Dublin %ateresting+. "Young Actor in Wales" was the subject of the talk at the 24 April Meeting of Chelmsford and District Welsh Society. 






















May Meeting with HELEN HOOKER


